

Arabic III-SYLLABUS 2017-2018

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I. Course Description, Goals and Highlights

This is an Intermediate course, build on language skills developed in Arabic I and II. In this course, students will have opportunities to develop more complex forms; vocabulary building principles and also will continue development of skill in conversation, reading, writing; and listening comprehension. This course is taught entirely in Arabic and students will be encouraged to extensive conversation in Arabic. By the end of the year, students will be able to communicate about many topics including health, food and nutrition, leisure time and vacation, life in city vs. live in the village, knowledge and education, autobiographical information, marriage life, and a whole unit about the Arabic language. Students will become more aware and gain knowledge of the culturally diverse Arabic-speaking world to develop insight into the nature of language and culture.

When you walk into this class, you will be entering a world where the focus language is Arabic. This will be a fun experience and it will contribute to your ability to understand and speak more Arabic in a shorter period of time in shaa Allah. **Do not be afraid to make mistakes—everyone will make lots of mistakes—it is OKAY.** You will be surprised by how well you are able to survive in an Arabic-speaking environment.

II. Expectations

- a) Students will be in their **assigned seat** and **working** on the first activity the minutes the class starts.
- b) Students will bring all necessary materials to class. This includes but is not limited to: a large three-ring binder, pencil with eraser and paper.
- c) Follow all school rules. All school rules will be enforced including the dress code.
- d) Cheating will not be tolerated.
- e) If you are traveling between classes, you are expected to attend class on time each day.
- f) Follow the “test-taking rules” during all tests and quizzes. Failure to follow rules will result in the student receiving a zero for that test.
- g) Upon returning from an absence you are expected to be prepared to participate in the day’s activities.
- h) You are required to use the class website for the daily/weekly homework and assessments among other instructions.
- i) Your full attention and active participation are expected to be your priorities during the entire class period.
- j) You are strongly encouraged to get your body accustomed to scheduled visits to the restroom during the school day. These visits should take place before and after classes and during breaks. Minimizing class interruptions benefits every ones learning.
- k) You will not be permitted to leave the class to go to the bathroom unless it is an absolute emergency.
- l) Respect others in the class and their right to learn.
- m) Respect the property of other students, as well as the school’s/teacher’s property. Respect their time and opportunity to learn.
- n) If you know in advance that you will be absent from school for a field trip or event you **must** get your work before the day of your absence. Students that do not obtain their work before the absence will receive a grade of zero. There are no exceptions.
- o) All **unexcused** missed work will receive a grade of "0". Under exceptional circumstances, students may be able to make up missed work. The eligibility for any make up work will be determined by the

teacher after discussing the situation with the student's parents. Please note that going on vacation/trips does not qualify as an exceptional circumstance.

III. Tests and Quizzes

- Once a week (usually Thursday) you will have a quiz covering material from that week. These quizzes will range in point value.
- Students must follow the test-taking rules for every quiz and test. Students caught cheating will receive a zero for the quiz and will not be permitted to re-take the quiz.
- All missed quizzes must be made up before the following weeks quiz. It is your responsibility to schedule the quiz make-up with Mu'alimah. Naima.

IV. Homework

- Homework is assigned on a daily basis. It serves to reinforce the day's lesson.
- Homework assignments are due the next school day at the beginning of class unless otherwise stated.
- Homework makes up **15%** of your final grade for this class.

V. Late Work

- No late work** can be accepted for a grade nor can exams or quizzes, unless prior arrangements are made with your instructor, or in the case of a verifiable emergency.
- You must bring your excuse within **three days** of the absence and schedule the make-up promptly

VI. Participation

- Participation includes but is not limited to: answering questions, working with a partner and taking notes.
- Participation is worth 25% of the final grade.

VII. Assessment

- Practice: Beginning activities and Homework projects.....25%
- Participation: Class Work, Communicative Activities, Reading, Being on Task20%
- Oral Performance: Formally assessed dialogues, Oral interviews and Presentations (Quizzes)....15%
- Written Work: tests, class notes, quarter finals and midterm: includes all chapters and materials studies during the quarter40%

IX. Secrets to Success.

- *Have a positive attitude and enjoy the language!
- *When you study, practice aloud with your parents, relative, friends (even with your pet!)
- *Do not only sit at a desk to study! Speak Arabic as you walk around school and at home.
- *When possible, study with a "responsible" classmate. Exchange your phone number with students in class. It helps in case of absences or forgotten assignments.
- *Watch documentary movies and listen to the radio in Arabic.
- *Read different materials in Arabic.
- *Make sure you keep an organized backpack/folder, book, workbook, and notebook. If taking organized notes is a difficult task, think about rewriting your notes after school: this is an excellent way to review what you learned during the day, and prepare for tests.
